Sulemana is a 12 year old pupil who dropped out from primary 1 due to his current medical condition and has a bleak future if nothing is done to avert the situation.

Sulemana was born on 5th January, 2005 in Nkwanta, in the Northern part of Volta region of Ghana to Salifu Mamudu, an uneducated poor farmer and Jamilatu Salifu, a petty trader. He was only 2 years old when it was realized that he was having a tumor which started from the teeth and later spread to his left eye, ear and brains. With both parents not having any knowledge of the condition Sulemana was not attended to until the growth got to an unbearable level when he was 6 years old.

Sulemana's first visit to the Korle-Bu teaching hospital was when he turned 6 years and the Doctors diagnosed his condition to be **neurofibromatosis** which require surgical operations to correct to save his EYE, EARS, TEETH AND BRAINS. If immediate steps are not taken to save Sulemana, complications of the neurofibromatosis

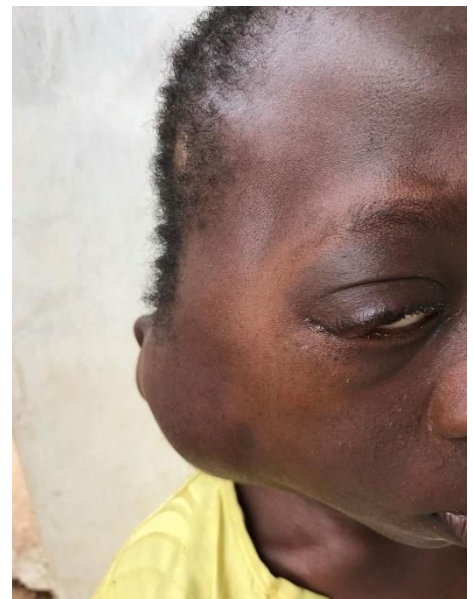
can lead to hearing loss, learning impairment, heart and blood vessel (cardiovascular) problems, loss of vision, and severe pain among others.

When a team of Doctors comprising of specialists in Eye, Ears, Teeth and Brains first reviewed his condition, it was estimated that his surgery will cost \$2,500.00. Subsequently announcements were made on GTV and the C.E.O of Engineers and Planners donated the said amount to the Korle-Bu teaching hospital.

However when the surgery was due, there was re-assessment by a new team of specialist from the USA and the total amount needed for the surgery was now estimated at **\$10,000.00** with a reservation of pantries of blood since he will be losing a lot of blood during the operation and will also take a longer time due to the diversion of the root of the tumor.

Sulemana's condition was discovered when the Treasure of Life Foundation embarked on "FEED THE HUNGRY OUTREACH" in Pantang Village, on 24th December, 2016.

We at the Treasure of Life Foundation believe that little Sulemana needs his health back and needs guarantees for his future healthcare and education. Moved by his plight, we have decided to embark on this **Every Life Counts Medical Campaign** to raise **\$12,500.00** for his surgery, further medical and educational needs
